Jaws caught in the beach net debate

IN January 2015, lifeguards investigated yet another shark sighting off Newcastle.

Just days after beaches reopened following the sighting of a 5-metre Great White, paddlers off Bar Beach reported a 3.5-metre shark.

Since the NSW shark meshing program was put in place in 1937, there has only been one fatal attack on a netted beach which occurred at Merewether, in 1951.

"In over 50 years, there has not been a fatal shark attack on a meshed beach," Primary Industries Minister, Stephen Whan said.

While this reduces the risks for humans, sharks and other sea life caught in the net cannot move and water is unable to move through their gills, so they often die.

In the last two decades, approximately 4000 marine animals have been caught in shark nets in NSW. Fewer than 150 of them were Great White or Tiger sharks, while over 1000 were either stingrays, dolphins, turtles, whales or seals.

Public opinion is divided about whether we should net beaches to protect swimmers or remove the nets to safeguard marine life.

To reduce the risk of attack surf lifesavers recommend swimming between the flags, avoiding swimming at dawn and dusk, and not swimming in river mouths where sharks feed.
