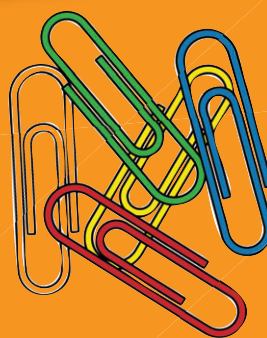
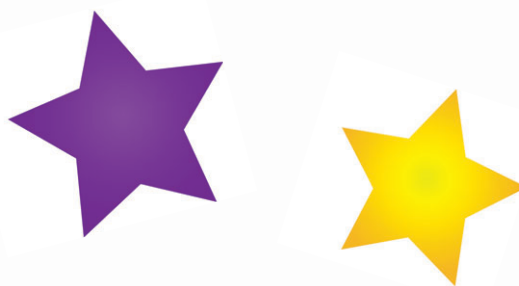

WAGGA'S Mater Dei Catholic College is founded in Catholic faith and justice and love. The College strives to be inclusive, learner centred and to seek excellence and wisdom.

The HSC results of 2013 affirmed our outstanding commitment to Academic Success.

Our 2013 Cohort achieved the following:

- Above State Average in 60% of our subjects;
- Mathematics was more than 10% above State Average;
- Metals and Engineering was 6.74% above State Average;

- Music was 6.26% above State Average;
- Ancient History was 6.22% above State Average;
- Four students attained an ATAR OF 94 or above; the best result ever! and
- Previous to 2013, Mater Dei was a "Top 200 School" in 2011 and 2012. This means that our Band 6 results, as a percentage of all results at the College, we were in the "Top 200 Schools" in NSW.

This title of "Top 200 School" is only one measure of HSC success; however, the fact that we have achieved this distinction in 2011 and 2012 with very strong results in 2013 means the culture

of academic success is prominent at Mater Dei Catholic College.

An example of Mater Dei learning innovation is TED, which is the Connected learning program specifically for Year 7 students.

It is a cross-curricular approach to learning for English, HSIE and Religion. Innovations in assessment, curriculum, instruction and professional development for staff, supported by an agile, modern learning environment promotes the development of 21st Century skills in students.

TED offers students choice in:

- How they learn;

- The pace at which they learn;
- Who they learn with; and,
- What technology can help them learn best.

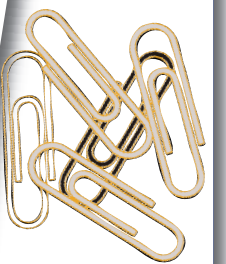

SACRED HEART SCHOOL KOORINGAL

SACRED Heart Koorringal is a K-6 Catholic Primary School located at 235-245 Lake Albert Road, Koorringal.

We operate in Stages, with Classes consisting of Early Stage 1 (Kinder), Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2), Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) and Stage 3 (Years 5 and 6).

At Sacred Heart Catholic School Christ is the foundation of all of our teaching and learning and therein commits us to love and service.

Our school is a faith filled community where our students are welcoming, compassionate and inclusive.

At Sacred Heart we encourage the development of the whole child through six practices: Human Development, Meaningful Learning, Collaboration, Communication, Inquiry and Self Responsibility.

Alongside these learning and teaching practices, we believe in developing dispositions for effective learning.

These are known as the Habits of Mind and are used to develop intelligent behaviour, creative thinking skills, problem solving and decision making.

Our students are aware of and practise these skills to become people who are empathetic, informed and have the skills to be lifelong learners.

Our students at Sacred Heart are exposed to a wide variety of activities and practices that are beneficial to their educational, emotional and social development.

Our "hands on" learning experiences include our Stephanie Alexander gardening program, our interactive Art program, the use of Google Doc technology throughout the school, and our Active After School Sports programs.

At Sacred Heart Catholic School we believe in shared leadership, so rather than voting for school captains or sports captains, all our Year 6 students take on a leadership role. The reason for this is that we see the potential leadership qualities in every single student in Year 6. Each student has different talents and interests, and with this in mind, we believe that spreading the leadership across the whole group is much more powerful and effective.

A lot of responsibility is placed on our Year 6 students, and the expectation is that they lead by example as they apply mindfulness in all areas of school life. This is a vital part in the development of them as young adults.

"Life is about balance," says Dr Ian Grant, who has been the College's Principal for 15 years, speaking of the school's operation.

"You have to get the balance right between academic opportunities, sporting involvement and social programmes that allow students to become successful members of the wider community.

"High School is also a time when students develop independence under the guidance of both the home and school.

"Our parent body are keen to be involved. This was amply borne out with over 85 per cent of parents making time to meet their student's teachers at the recent Parent Teacher evenings."

Asked for one recent example of this partnership, Dr Grant cited the Swimming Carnival in the Combined Wagga Wagga High Schools competition.

"Our team was probably outgunned as individual swimmers but the team effort dragged them over the line successfully defending the title that they had held for the last eight years," he said.

Every event was contested meaning that swimmers sacrificed individual specializations for team points.

"I encourage interested families to come out to the school on April 1 for a tour of the facilities and to hear from key staff."

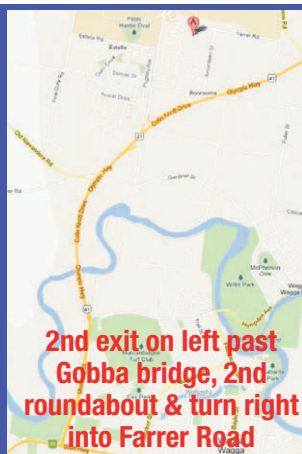
