If you want to find him, the police might help. I don't even know if he is still in Western Australia.



Dear Father McAlinden,

The resolution of the problems associated with your ministry has been reconcern to me for some time. In confidence I have discussed the issues with Bishop Malone and the Deans. After listening to their advice I have made the following decisions:-

In the light of your admission to Fr Brian Lucas and other evidence I inform you:

- 1. That I request you to petition the Holy See for a rescript of Laicization.
- That I have begun the process to declare that you have an impediment to the exercise
 of Orders (Canon 1044). This impediment is based on Canon 277 of the 1983 Code
 of Canon Law. This process has commenced this day and I wanted to inform you of
 your rights.
 - a) You-have the right to be heard, to be informed of the facts and to offer contrary evidence.
 - b) You also have the right to the assistance of a Canonical expert. If you wish the Diocese will make an independent Canonist available to you.
 - c) You have the right of recourse to the Congregation of the Clergy if you do not accept my decision (Canons 1732-1737).
 - d) Your good name will be protected by the confidential nature of this process
 - e) Should the impediment be declared I assure you that your right to appropriate support will be honoured by the Diocese of Maifland-Newcastle.

By the time you receive this letter, Bishop Leo Clarke's resignation as Bishop of this Diocese of Maitiand-Newcastle, will have been announced by the Holy See. As Coadjutor Bishop I will immediately become the Bishop of the Diocese.

Therefore Bishop Clarke has referred your confidential latter of October 26 to me for attention.

I regret that one of my first duties as Bishop is to continue Canonical procedures against one of the priests of the Diocese. However, because of the gravity of the allegations against you, the evidence supporting those allegations and after full and continual consultation with Bishop Clarke over many months, I have no alternative but to reaffirm the contents of Bishop Clarke's letter to you of October 19.



I write to notify you that one of our priests, Fr Denis McAlinden, has been accused sexual assault of children.

This information has come to us from members of ALSALIS family who do not wish to be involved in any civil action in this regard. We also believe that there are other victims apart from ALSALIS family. These have not indicated at this stage any wish to take the matter to the police. There is reference in one of his letters to a court case in Perth but we have no other details of it.

However, I think this is a matter where "intelligence" could well be given to the police. We do not have an address for him in this country. At present he is in England celebrating his Galdern Jubilee despite the fact that his facilities have been removed since 1993. We suspect that he will come back to Australia late in August and reside somewhere in the Bunbury-Region of Western Australia. Family are unable to give an exact address.

I'm taking off on Sunday for 4 weeks leave. Ring me before then if you need to or after 16th September.
