Dear Father McAlinden,

The resolution of the problems associated with your ministry has been a concern to me for some time. In confidence I have discussed the issues with Bishop Malone and the Deans. After listening to their advice I have made the following decisions:-

In the light of your admission to Fr Brian Lucas and other evidence I inform you:

1. That I request you to petition the Holy See for a rescript of Laicization.
2. That I have begun the process to declare that you have an impediment to the exercise of Orders (Canon 1044). This impediment is based on Canon 277 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law. This process has commenced this day and I wanted to inform you of your rights.
 - a) You have the right to be heard, to be informed of the facts and to offer contrary evidence.
 - b) You also have the right to the assistance of a Canonical expert. If you wish the Diocese will make an independent Canonist available to you.
 - c) You have the right of recourse to the Congregation of the Clergy if you do not accept my decision (Canons 1732-1737).
 - d) Your good name will be protected by the confidential nature of this process and
 - e) Should the impediment be declared I assure you that your right to appropriate support will be honoured by the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle.

Father, the next phase of this process will take place in 15 days when I will send you a summary of the evidence supporting the claim in which you are impeded to carry out your ministry properly. You have 15 days from that date in which to prepare and make your response to me. You will then be informed by a Decree of my decision.

Finally I beg you, for the sake of souls and the good of the Church, to cooperate in this matter so that it may be speedily resolved.

A speedy resolution of this whole matter will be in your own good interests as I have it on very good authority that some people are threatening seriously to take this whole matter to the police.

I trust that you will cooperate in every way.

Dear Bishop,

Your extraordinary letter of 19th October just to hand, as I have just now come back from hospital after major surgery (5½ hours); and due to return for further similar operation as soon as I am strong enough. To facilitate this I've been advised to accept a generous invitation to recuperate in a country district, over two hundred kms from here, for at least a few weeks. Hence, there is no way that I am in a fit state at present, physically or mentally, to contemplate making any such drastic decision as your letter has suggested.

Indeed, I labelled your letter "extraordinary", recalling that your latest correspondence, received in the Philippines, advised that I should live as a "retired priest" in a climate that would be acceptable. Hence, it makes one wonder whether or not this latest recommendation is indeed your own idea or merely the continuation of Alan Hart's vendetta, who attempted to anticipate it a few years ago, when he wrote me at my sister's home in England, as being the letter to "Mr. D. N. Allden", and advising my niece at Lambton to do likewise.

Incidentally, the word "confidential" has a way hollow ring as far as Maitland is concerned: Brian Lucas convinced me, against my better judgement, to accept that the information I gave him would be held in strict confidence by the Bishop; yet, within a few weeks, the same niece mentioned above, was able to repeat it on the testimony of Alan Hart.

As I have no Code of Canon Law with me, I should appreciate the quotations from the Canons as mentioned in your letter.

I hasten to forward this letter so that you may delay whatever phase of the process you have decided upon in order that I shall be in a fit state to give it due thought and adequate response, and

Dear Father,

By the time you receive this letter, Bishop Leo Clarke's resignation as Bishop of this Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle, will have been announced by the Holy See. As Coadjutor Bishop I will immediately become the Bishop of the Diocese.

Therefore Bishop Clarke has referred your confidential letter of October 26 to me for attention.

I regret that one of my first duties as Bishop is to continue Canonical procedures against one of the priests of the Diocese. However, because of the gravity of the allegations against you, the evidence supporting those allegations and after full and continual consultation with Bishop Clarke over many months, I have no alternative but to reaffirm the contents of Bishop Clarke's letter to you of October 19.

I am sorry that you are in ill health, but Bishop Clarke's time frame still stands i.e., "the next phase of this process will take place in 15 days when I will send you a summary of the evidence supporting the claim in which you are impeded to carry out your ministry properly. You have 15 days from that date in which to prepare and make your response to me. You will then be informed by a Decree of my decision."

The relevant Canons are attached and I'm sure you could access Canonical advice in Western Australia should you wish to do so.

In conclusion may I emphasise the seriousness of the allegations and the real possibility of police intervention.
