Caravan park plan under fire

NORTH Goulburn once had a 'shanty town' and now it's getting another one, Cr Margaret O'Neill says.

Her parting shot at Tuesday's Council meeting came as she and two other councillors sought to put a proposed 105-site caravan park development "to death."

The trio - including Crs Neil Penning and Geoff Peterson - lodged a rescission motion on Wednesday against the six votes to three approval.

They accused developers - Funtime Investments, owned by the Burrows family - of pushing through

high density housing under the guise of a caravan park.

The company itself has acknowledged there won't be any caravans on the 41 long-term sites, only on shorter stay areas.

The councillors have questioned its permissibility in the B6 Enterprise corridor.

"Our strategic planning will be thrown out the window with this motion (to approve the project)," Cr O'Neill said.

"We'll have residential in an industrial area. We're trying to build up our image and it's not the right place to have this thing stuck out there."
