

## Yellow Dodge, hello museum

GOULBURN'S gorgeous yellow 1938 Dodge ambulance is destined for a new life in a museum at Temora.

The distinctive vehicle began its life in Kyogle and travelled 238,000 miles from 1938 to 1964.

It was 'retired' to Point Clare, near Gosford before space restrictions saw its relocation

to Goulburn. Now the Temora Rural Museum wants to borrow the Dodge for its extensive collection.

# CBD goes out with a 'bang'

LUNCHTIME trade in Goulburn's CBD was brought to a standstill on Wednesday by a power outage that hit more than 5500 homes and businesses.

Retailers, banks, cafes and other outlets in the Auburn Street shopping strip and the Bourke and Sloane St commercial areas were without power for up to two hours.

The council civic centre, the NSW Government Human Services Department and shops in Centro Mall were all affected, as were thousands of homes.

The outage had initially been sourced to Essential Energy's Clinton Street Zone Substation, with reports of a "loud bang" heard at around 11am.

But Essential Energy traced the fault back to an underground cable on Sloane St
