Light on detail

\$28m retail DA deficient: Council planners

PLANNERS have outlined a raft of "deficiencies" in a company's development application for a \$28 million retail project.

They're calling for much more detailed information on A&A Lederer's Marketplace redevelopment, including traffic impacts from partially closing off Verner St.

In the process, they've taken a swipe at the quality of documentation supplied.

"It is somewhat disappointing that a proposal of this significance to Goulburn and surrounds has been provided such limited and

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in a timely manner."

Council has asked for a heritage impact statement and a streetscape assessment, an economic impact statement, traffic assessment report, water cycle management study, a report regarding the impact on council water infrastructure and a contamination study, given part of the site covers a former car yard.

That was on May 15.

Planning director Chris Stewart said late last week the company had not furnished the information, but he expected this to change.

"We know they have formed a consultancy team and it is an extensive team, given the issues

raised," he said.

"They have also had discussions with planning and water services staff."

Planners want greater justification for closing Verner St between Clinton Lane and Sloane St and an economic impact statement that considers the wider retail catchment.

The company is expanding the existing Marketplace, but adding a 7038 square metre Big W store, 12 specialty stores, pedestrian mall areas and 700 car parking spaces, 420 of those underground.

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
