MORE than 200 cyclists from across NSW and the ACT flocked to Goulburn on Sunday for the third annual Goulburn Grand Prix Cycle Challenge.

MP fires up over protest Schultz calls for tougher immigration laws

Member for Hume Alby Schultz has labelled multiculturalism as a "fundamental failure" and called for "an urgent overhaul" of Australia's immigration policy following recent protests in Sydney's CBD.

"In the Coalition Party Room this week I raised my grave concerns about the future internal security of this country and called for an urgent overhaul of our immigration policies following the disgraceful riots in the Sydney CBD over the

weekend (September 15)," Mr Schultz said.

"These riots are a timely reminder as we begin to mark the 10th anniversary of the atrocious Bali bombings next month that Australia needs to review its policies which purportedly safeguard our national security. This need is further indicated by our security organisations warning us of the potential for more frequent incidences of violence which are borne of the religious and ethnic hatreds inherent

within both newcomers and second or third generation Australians.

"As the make-up of Australian society has become more and more diverse over recent decades, so too has there been a dramatic increase in the likelihood of a potential collapse of law and order at the hands of opportunistic perpetrators due to these ethnic and religious differences. The problem is that Christians do not have a tendency to take to the streets when people denigrate their beliefs."

"The need to reform immigration policy is clearly shared by competent and well-respected journalist Paul Kelly who, 24 hours after I raised my concerns in the Party Room, published an opinion piece in *The Australian* (Wednesday, September 19, page 12) which reflects on how these riots indicate 'a failure of Australia's immigration and integration policies and demands a reappraisal from our political elites'.
