# Power plant put on ice

## But campaigners hold back the bubbly

DISTRICT residents are taking cautious comfort in AGL's announcement it will halt all work on its Dalton power project.

The company is suspending its \$1.5 billion gas fired power station at Dalton due to "market conditions," it announced to the Stock Exchange late Friday afternoon.

AGL spokeswoman Julia Quinn cited falling electricity demand as one of a

"range of factors" behind the decision. It followed a review of market conditions. She rejected suggestions Gunning and Dalton community opposition was at play but residents believed otherwise.

AGL does not expect to start work "any-time soon" on the first phase 1000MW peaking plant, 4km northwest of Dalton.

Upper Lachlan Environmental

Association president Alistair Waine said he was not overly relieved by the announcement, despite a long campaign.

"We are basically of the same mind, despite what they say. We have no reason to trust them," he told the *Post*.

"...Until their five-year approval is up, I am not going to get excited. As long as they still have approval, I'm scared. We

will remain vigilant."

Under approval conditions handed down by the Planning Assessment Commission (PAC) in July, AGL had to seal roads and establish a community consultative committee before commencement.
