Hostel wins planning tick

Council to decide homeless facility

COUNCIL'S planning department has recommended approval for the ongoing operation of St Vincent de Paul's homeless men's hostel in Market St.

With its two-year trial period now expired, councillors will decide Kennedy House's fate at Wednesday night's meeting.

During the 28-day exhibition period, Council received more than 22 community submissions on the matter with interested parties vigorously pledging their support

for and against the proposal.

Concerns raised by the public included anecdotal reports of anti-social and alleged criminal behaviour by some residents, the facility's proximity to Belmore Park and whether management was equipped to deal with the unique needs of some of the more challenging clients.

Some of the men who call Kennedy House home suffer from mental illness, drug and alcohol issues or have been released directly from prison into the Society's care.

Planners have recognised the challenges and said it was difficult to quantify anti-social behaviour. At the same time, they've

stated Kennedy House operators have always been prepared to work with authorities to resolve issues.

They're suggesting a community consultative committee be established if permanent approval is granted.
