38th sale for Cadell

The Cadell Border Leicester Stud will hold its 38th on-property sale, on Friday, October 4, 2013, commencing at 1.30pm.

On offer that day will be 25 stud rams, 150 flock rams and 30 stud ewes.

Cadell is a fully vaccinated MN3 flock. The stud has been part of the Lambplan program for seven years and all figures will be available on the day of the sale. Deferred payment until June 2014 is available on flock rams, if required, arrangements for this must be made through selling agents, Elders and Landmark Wagga. Cadell Stud, which was established in 1946, has a breeding flock of 1000 adult ewes.

This makes it the largest Border Leicester Stud in Australia which keeps individual pedigrees and Lambplan figures.

The stud has always based its breeding on strong family bloodlines. Many of these are 40 years old and provide a solid platform to build on.

Whether it is in the show ring or hanging up, Ridgehaven Poll Dorsets excel.

At the recent Bedgerabong Show, Ridgehaven Poll Dorsets won Supreme Champion Meat Breeds ram.

The Supreme Champion Ram was Ridgehaven "Barney", sired by Ridgehaven T128.

The judges at Bedgerabong and at the earlier NSW Dorset Championships both commented on his excellent muscling and correct structure.

Ridgehaven has always breed rams that will excel in the commercial lamb industry.

This is seen through their own prime lamb production, results of their many returning clients and through undertaking a carcass analysis benchmarking trials in conjunction with regional abattoirs. All the lambs, sourced from the Legge families prime lamb enterprise, not their stud flock, were sired by Ridgehaven rams.

The 12-16 week old lambs were processed to meet the domestic lamb market with a target dressed carcass weight of 18-24kg.

The MSA meat assessors report said that the carcasses were of extremely high standard, they were the shape, size and fat coverage they wanted.

They said that for the domestic market did couldn't see any way they could really improve on the lambs that were produced.

A number of the 12-16 week old lambs were too heavy to fit the weight criteria for the trial, so were sold in the local Forbes saleyards.

Like many progeny sired by Ridgehaven rams regularly do, they achieved prices that reflected their high quality.

The results from this trial and achieved regularly in the saleyards con-

tinues to show Ridgehaven rams produce the lamb the market demands.

Ridgehaven aims to breed Poll Dorset rams that will produce maximum prime lamb return, with a focus on length, muscle and ease of lambing.

Ridgehaven rams are bred so that their progeny have the potential to be marketed at any stage from suckers to heavy export lambs.

This allows the lamb producer to have the flexibility to market their lambs at the most profitable or convenient time.

We would like to congratulate our clients who consistently get top prices for their suckers and older lambs both in the saleyards and over the hooks.

Since the foundation of Ridgehaven in 1965, the aim of the stud hasn't changed - that is to breed rams that meet the commercial lamb producers' needs.

* A high yielding carcass with length and width through the loin, and a rounded hindquarter shape.

ter shape.

* High growth rates.
* Providing a balanced fat coverage so lambs can be easily marketed at any age and don't run to fat.

* Structural soundness, focussing on feet and leg setting for serving ability and ram longevity.

* Smooth shoulder and neck setting for ease of lambing.

* Clean open faces, minimising grass seed issues in lambs.

Ridgehaven do this through a strict breeding program, using their own genetics to stabilize the genetic pool, and introducing genetics from studs that match our objectives.

In conjunction with their breeding program they use performance testing by objective measurements using Lambplan and Stockscan, carcass analysis by recognised meat assessors at local abattoirs and feedback from our ram buyers and stock agents.

Ridgehaven back up their statements by using their flock rams in their own commercial prime lamb enterprise and

achieving great results.

The Ridgehaven Poll Dorset stud is currently run by Jessie Legge and family (Ruth and Graeme Klingner, Isabele and Peter Roberts and Floyd Legge).

Ridgehaven is one of the largest Poll Dorset studs in Australia, selling around 400 Poll Dorset rams each year.

Ridgehaven rams are available at the Ridgehaven Poll Dorset ram sale on Thursday, September 12 and for private sale at both their properties, "Ridgehaven" Cudal and "Muddy Water" Forbes.

The Ridgehaven Ram sale will be held at the Cudal property, at 1pm on Thursday, September 12. There will be 10 stud rams and 140 flock rams offered and these rams will have both Lambplan and Stockscan figures available.

A barbecue lunch will be provided from 12pm.
