MOST REV JOHN TOOHEY, 9.D., BISHOP OF MAITLAND.

My Lord Bishop,

Some weeks ago I had a letter from Bishop Gavallera, I.M.C., in Nyeri, Kenya, in which he said he intended writing to you. I thought it best to explain the circumstances that brought about this correspondence. You had spoken frequently of the shortage of priests in the Dicand placed it as one of the reasons why you could not see your way clear to release me for the Missions — I fully realize from my interview with you on Sept. 29th. that then are other serious obstacles also. Well, my Lord, I had previously written to Bishop Cavallera, thinking he may have a priest in his diocese who was didestisfied with missional life or was finding it too strenuous, and I had some hope that an exchange might be brought about. As it turned on

il his priests belonged to Heligious the Bishop explained h Orders or Congregations, and could be put to other work at home by their Superiors. He also said that he knew you very well, and would take it upon himself to write to you on my behalf. Remembering our conversation on Sept. 29th., and understanding that you felt you could not recommend me for Incardination . into another Diocese, owing to previous misconduct, I can see that such a request from Bishop Cavallers might place you in a somewhat unpleasant nosition. None of this I had foreseen when I wrote to him, as I had not anticipated that of all the Bishops in Missionary Countries I should have chosen to write to one who awas your host when he was Rector of Propaganda I have prayed much about the matter and College in Rome. felt prompted to make the following suggestion. Perhaps the Bishop might take me on loan for a few years without the recommendations necessary for Incardination, and then let him make his own decision at the end of that time. I know the idea of loan is not ideal, and that only Incardination is the recommended thing, but perhaps even this admits of exceptions. Could thir be a solution for my caes?

Please, my Lord, do not think that I am not awere of the needs of the Diocese, or that I do not appreciate your positions Bishop with a shortage of priests. But it seems a shame that hundreds of thousands of people are just clamouring for the Maith in Africa and are deprived through the chortage of priests. Besides, could we not trust that God will supply our needs for more priests in this piocese if we try to be more generous towards the Missions. In this way I feel I could still serve the Diocese.
