

# ANZAC DAY SERVICES

On Anzac Day we remember all Australians who served or died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations. This Anzac Day commemorates the 99th anniversary of the landings on Gallipoli of April 25, 1915.

In Canberra the Australian War Memorial, in close cooperation with the RSL ACT, hosts the Dawn Service and the Anzac Day Ceremony. This year the Dawn Service will be preceded by a display of images projected on the façade of the Memorial from 9pm on Thursday, April 24, and from 5am on the 25th there will be a moving tribute to the 40 servicemen who lost their lives in Afghanistan.

This year the National Ceremony is expected to draw record crowds, as in attendance will be Their Royal Highnesses The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge, as well as our four living Victoria Cross recipients.

Owing to the expected crowds, both the Dawn Service and National Ceremony will be projected onto large screens, including one located in the Sculpture Garden, and visitors are encouraged to use free park-and-ride shuttle services or public transport to attend the ceremonies.

### PRE-DAWN SERVICE PROGRAM

(Thursday, April 24)

Commencing at 9pm, images of Australian servicemen and servicewomen will be projected onto the façade of the Memorial throughout the night.

(Friday, April 25)

At 4.25am readings from diaries and personal letters of those who have experienced war will be read by current service personnel. An Indigenous serviceman will also play the didgeridoo from the parapet of the Memorial. Visitors are encouraged to arrive early from 4.15am.

At 5am will commence a moving tribute to the 40 servicemen killed in Afghanistan.

### DAWN SERVICE

(Friday, April 25)

At 5.30am the Dawn Service will begin on the Memorial's Parade Ground. Limited seating is available but cannot be booked or reserved.

On-site lighting will be limited, and visitors are encouraged to bring personal torches.

Battery-powered candles, poppies, and orders of service will be available on-site for a small donation.

The Memorial's Commemorative Area will open 15 minutes after the conclusion of the Dawn Service and will remain open until approximately 8am.

### ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER COMMEMORATIVE CEREMONY

Commencing at 6.30am, a ceremony will commence at the Aboriginal Memorial Plaque located west of the walking track at the foot of Mount Ainslie.

### NATIONAL CEREMONY

The National Ceremony will begin at 10.15am on the Memorial's Parade Ground. Visitors are encouraged to arrive from 9am, with ticket-holders asked to be seated by 10am.

RSL is privileged to honour veterans from conflicts post-1990 by having these servicemen and servicewomen lead the veterans' march.

In attendance at the National Ceremony will be Their Royal Highnesses The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.

The National Ceremony will include a fly-over by RAAF aircraft.

Poppies and order of service programs will be available on-site for a small donation.

Visitors are encouraged to bring water and sunscreen and to dress for the cool conditions.

### ROAD CLOSURES

Road closures will be in effect from 4.00 am until 1.00 pm, which will limit public access to parking at the Memorial. The large number of visitors in attendance at the ceremony will also limit the amount of available parking on site. Please also note that parking is no longer available at the foot of Mount Ainslie.

### PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION

Road closures around the Memorial take effect from 4am to 1pm on 25 April.

On-site parking is extremely limited. Free park-and-ride shuttles and public transport are the best way to get to the Memorial's Anzac Day services.

Limited on-site parking will be available for visitors with government-issued mobility impairment passes.

Free park-and-ride shuttle services for both the Dawn Service and the National Ceremony will run back and forth between the Memorial and the Russell Offices (Sir Thomas Blamey Square) and the Majura Park car park (Dakota bus stop).

Dawn Service shuttles will operate from 4am to 5.10am, with return services departing the Memorial from approximately 6.15am.

National Ceremony shuttles will operate from 8.30am to 10am, with return services departing the Memorial from approximately 12.15pm.

ACTION Buses will also provide interchange services from Civic, Belconnen, Gungahlin, Tuggeranong, and Woden. Visit the ACTION website for timetable information.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

First aid and ambulance staff will be located on-site.

In the event of wet weather, all services and activities will proceed unless conditions become dangerous.

The Terrace Café will be open from 6am, and water can be obtained from various sale points at the Memorial.

The pre-Dawn Service program and the Dawn Service can be cold and wet; visitors are encouraged to rug up and wear enclosed footwear.

### LAST POST CEREMONY

At 4.55pm in the Memorial's Commemorative Area Corporal Daniel Keighran VC will deliver the Memorial's Last Post Ceremony, which will share the personal story of Private Thomas Anderson Whyte of the 10th Battalion who fought with the AIF on Gallipoli.

5.45am - Dawn service at the cenotaph followed by breakfast at the Cooma Ex-Services Club

10.30am - Memorial march from Mack's Corner to the cenotaph, followed by commemorative service and a morning tea

2pm - Two-up at the Ex-Services Club

#### Goulburn

5.30am: Dawn service at Belmore Park. Assemble at the honour roll at 5am.

6am: Breakfast at the Soldiers Club for dawn service and war graves attendees.

9am: Memorial church services at St Saviour's Cathedral and Sts Peter and Paul's Cathedral.

11am: March commences along Auburn Street. Mid-morning commemorative service will commence at the honour roll in Belmore Park at the conclusion of the march.

12.30pm: Luncheon at the Soldiers Club for veterans, ex-servicemen and women, members and ex-members of the Australian Defence Force, and Allied Servicemen and Women. Entry to the luncheon is by ticket only.

10.30am - March up Sheridan Street to the main cenotaph, followed by the main ceremony at 11am

#### Gundaroo

5.30am: Dawn service at the war memorial at the corner Cork and Harp streets.

#### Gunning

5.45am: Dawn service at the Gunning Cenotaph, followed by breakfast.

10.45am: March from the Shell Service Station to the cenotaph.

11am: Main service at the cenotaph.

#### Jindabyne

6am - Dawn service at Banjo Patterson Park, followed by breakfast at the Lions club

9.30am - March from the Old Town Centre to the Jindabyne Memorial Hall, followed by commemorative service

#### Queanbeyan

5.15am: Meet at the Queanbeyan RSL building for the dawn service.

10am: Assemble at the RSL building for the march to the First World War memorial.

10.30am: First World War memorial service.

#### Yass

5.25am - Dawn service at Yass Soldiers Memorial Hall, with breakfast served after.

10am - Assemble for march down Comne Street from Lead Street to Soldiers Memorial Hall.
