Moree and Gunnedah to put it all on the line in minor semi-final

DO or die, all or nothing and no more tomorrows.

They are all sporting clichés generally used at this time of the year, and when Moree and Gunnedah run out onto Weebolla Oval on Saturday afternoon they will have one thing on their mind - victory

For the victor, an appointment with either Pirates or Narrabri awaits in a fortnight.

Gunnedah will have fond memories of the last time they headed north when they hit the ground running and took an unlikely 20-0 lead to the break.

On that occasion the Bulls fumbled their way through the opening half.

The Devils then withstood a second-half fight back from the Bulls to register a deserved 33-21 victory, but the Bulls returned the favour with a comprehensive 48-17 win two weeks ago.

Bulls coach, Damien Kelly, felt that particular performance was a sign his side had awoken from their mid-season slumber and turned the corner.

ance," Kelly said.

"But we're running out of time to get it right; there are no more tomorrows.

"It's the last game at Moree for a lot of the boys - myself included - so we won't be together again after this year. It's our last chance to achieve something as a group."

To defend their title they'll have to do it the hard way.

Gunnedah's strength lies in their forwards and Kelly said the Bulls would look to adopt a similar game plan to the one which proved successful 14 days ago.

Devils Nik co-coach Hannaford said with an entire season depending on the outcome of Saturday's match-up, the importance could not be understated.

"We need this win," he said.

"It's all or nothing."

Last weekend the Devils found another gear to churn out a 36-31 away victory against the second-placed Pirates.

"The Pirates' win was a big

"It was a much better perform- confidence-booster," Hannaford said. "It was a big improvement on the week before but still not without its faults."

Kelly said the game would be won in the middle with Gunnedah fielding a strong forward pack.

However, they will go into the match missing scrumhalf Dave Heyman who is out indefinitely with a skull fracture.

"They've got some big boys up front so we'll need to move them around a bit - it worked for us last time down there so we'll look to do the same, but we've got to be careful about it," Kelly said.

"We need to take care of the rucks at the breakdown - that's where the game will be won."

Kelly admitted he was looking forward to having some time away from the rugby field whenever the Bulls' season was to finish.

"I'm looking forward to a break because I didn't think I'd be playing again this season, but here we are.'

Juniors to meet nemesis in Moree

THE 2014 season has been another successful year for the under 18s, securing the minor premiership.

The team has had to work extremely hard to build around a new set of players and combinations, and has steadily progressed throughout the year overcoming injuries along the way.

We have six players returning from last year who have stepped up to lead the side this year.

Pirates have been our nemesis all year and despite not losing a game to them have pushed the side to play its best rugby to beat the well drilled side.

It is a fairly even match-up across the park and we are very aware of their potential to score points.

The key to beating Pirates is at the breakdown. We need to be active there and each player needs to play an effective role to shut their opposing number down.

Having played the team three times this year, we are familiar with their game style

and have been working to shut their opportunities down, especially in the middle of the park through their forwards.

We go into the game with our centre pairing out, however local boy Duncan Woods will be moving from number eight to 12 to add a new dimension to our back line. Duncan is a hard-hitting, elusive ball runner who gains excellent ground with ball inhand so will be one to watch.

This game sees the return of our captain James Readford who has been out with injury for the last month. James will add aggression and direction at the breakdown and his leadership qualities will be appreciated by the boys on the paddock.

War horse Adam Duncan, playing in his final year, will need to be strong across the paddock, especially shutting down the 10 channel where the Pirates' forwards like to push. Adam's job has become a lot easier with the return of James.

Our front three will need to work especially hard against a very strong forward pack. Mitchell Parker and Josh Strange have been exceptionally strong all year and are

capably aided by Mitchell Clarke, Keagan Size and Ben Copeland. Our forward pack is extremely mobile and their agility and strength allow us to cover the field a lot quicker and more effectively than a lot of other sides.

The key to the game is to get to the outside backs who are capably lead by Dylan Chown who is the leading try-scorer and point scorer for the zone and Sinclair George.

These two boys have forged a very strong combination this year and their directional play is outstanding given their age. They are the linchpin to capitalising on the solid work of the forwards. Their combination has scored and set up some pretty exceptional passages of rugby this year and is exciting to watch.

Pirates have a very strong back line who can score points very quickly so the boys need to be directing our backs to counteract this

Our set play needs to be tight and we need to punish any opportunity we get in this area. Our line outs have been a definite
