Since the 'Going Home Staying Home' reforms, women and children fleeing violent homes have less places to go that are women-only. Out of 100 services run by women, for women, there are now 14 left.

The Ask: ensure 24/7 care, support women's services, provide certainty.

Dubbo Emergency Accommodation

(Dubbo Women's Refuge) **Issue:** Lost tender after years of operating. Women with drug and alcohol problems are now being housed with women and children escaping DV. Lost court advocacy and other programs. Very high local DV rate.

The Ask: Must separate general homeless women from women and children escaping DV to ensure safety.

DV rate: per 100.000 population: 798



Lismore Women and Children's Refuge

Issue: Lost tender after 36 vears. Closest refuges Grafton and Tweed Heads. more than one hour away. The Ask: Extend temporary funding until at least June 2017 to ensure Lismore continues to have a refuge. **DV rate:** per 100,000 population: 341

Taree Women and Children's Refuge

Issue: Lost tender after more than 30 years. Operation of new refuge uncertain. Greater Taree Council has formally sought information from new operators. Extremely high local DV rate.

The Ask: Ensure refuge continues to operate 24/7 with qualified staff due to high local need. DV rate: per 100,000 population: 788
